

The University of Southern California's (USC) Village displays a high level of design and construction quality.

A major design requirement was to develop a facility in Collegiate Gothic Architectural style to reflect USC's proud campus heritage and legacy. The architectural style was accomplished by integrating thin brick adhered veneer, anchored brick veneer attached to structural concrete masonry units backup with a fleming anchor system and mechanically anchored hand-set pre-cast elements.

Combinations of colors and textures in modified bond brick patterns express campus tradition in both performance and importance. By projecting brick in an organized fashion, this facility shows unique design yet blends with the campus.

The detail of USC Village is highlighted by the creative use of brick paving in the courtyards and walkways surrounding the buildings.
